### Trustees' Annual Report Year ended 31 December 2021

### Structure, Governance and Management

The congregation is a registered charity, number SC033757 and is administered in accordance with the terms of the Model Deed of Constitution and is subject to the Acts and Regulations of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland.

The Rev. Benjamin Abeledo is the Minister. He was ordained in mid 2019. He has been serving us loyally since but particularly during this last challenging year.

Members of the Kirk Session and the Congregational Board are the charity trustees. The Minister is the chairman. The Kirk Session members are the Minister and the Elders of the church. The Kirk Session, which meets six times a year, is responsible for spiritual affairs within the church.

The Congregational Board is responsible for financial affairs and the maintenance of properties. The Board is chaired by the minister and meets six times in a year. Certain matters are delegated to the Finance Committee and the Property Committee as appropriate.

### Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

The Kirk Session members are the Elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery.

The Congregational Board is appointed from within the congregation. Members of the congregation are invited to nominate individuals who are believed to have the skills and commitment to contribute to the management affairs of the Church. Board Members are then appointed at the Stated Annual Meeting and serve for a period of three years after which they can seek re-election at the next Stated Annual Meeting. Due to COVID restrictions, elections have been suspended since March 2020.

### **Governing Document**

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the Deed of Constitution (or Deed of Constitution (Unitary Form)).

### **Organisational Structure**

As indicated above.

### **Objectives and Activities**

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a

territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

The Activities of the Church revolve around services of worship and include Sunday School, Youth Group, Messy Church, Bible Study and Prayer Groups, Social Club, Guild and Boys Brigade.

Services of worship in Blairgowrie Parish Church are aimed to meet the needs of the different age groups in our community, both members of the congregation and their families and those who come seeking some form of spirituality in their lives. Family services, aimed at the younger members, use up to date methods of presentation employing available audio-visual technology. More traditional forms of worship are used to appeal to the needs of the more mature worshippers.

The worship moves out into the community in our pastoral care for our housebound folk and members in times of crisis and goes out to the whole community in the town to offer services for funerals and weddings, whether those in need of these services are church members or not.

The Sunday School and youth group use a variety of activities and materials for Christian education. The aim is to equip our young people to take their place in our community with the backing of a Christian ethos, giving them roots in our family of faith. Both the Guild and the Social Club, in addition to their traditional activities, devote much time and energy to fund raising for various Charities. The Boys Brigade Company has active Anchor and Junior sections, with the Company Section currently suspended due to insufficient officer numbers.

### Trustees' Annual Report (continued) Year ended 31 December 2021

### **Achievements and Performance**

The impact of COVID-19 legislation since March 2020 has been significant, with all the normal activities either severely curtailed or halted, reflecting Scottish Government and national church guidance and/or legislation. New ways of achieving our objectives have been implemented.

When legislation allowed, the church was open regularly for Sunday worship with restricted numbers required. Advent family and children's services were held this year with those attending asked to socially distance. Messy Church and Sunday School resumed meeting in person when legislation permitted in the final quarter of the year. The Guild restarted in the autumn but was required to halt in-person meetings for the month of December. The latest Government guidance indicates that in-person meeting can resume in February 2022.

To support worship throughout the COVID period, we have continued to improve our website which now includes more resources, a weekly pastoral letter and links to other materials. Audio recordings of a weekly service are available online and through our CD provision to those without internet access. In addition, a weekly video recording of the service is now posted online. As a result, the church website is well used. In addition, a Facebook page has been introduced to highlight weekly events and intimations. The church

newsletter continues to be published, the church contributes to the community magazine and the local newspaper includes a summary of each service with intimations.

The minister continues to be available throughout the pandemic for pastoral support and parish funerals of which there were twenty-seven. Weddings and baptisms have been held within COVID restrictions in place at the time.

Encouragingly, both the Anchor and Junior Sections of the Boys' Brigade restarted with a good number of boys attending, with new helpers coming forward to support existing officers.

Church business has continued using online meetings for both the Kirk Session and The Congregational Board. Most manage to attend. Two elders and one Congregational Board member stepped down from active duty with two long-serving elders dying whilst in post.

Very significant building works have been undertaken in the past twelve months, supported by Presbytery, and these are progressing in a planned and managed way.

This year the congregation has supported the work of Christian Aid and two community causes.

Church membership stands at 630 with another 58 on the Supplementary Roll. There were 25 deaths. We added 5 members by Certificate of Transference. One member left by Certificate of Transference – all figures as of 31 December 2021.

### **Financial Review**

The Accounts have been compiled as Receipts and Payments. The comparative figures for the year 2020 have been adjusted to reflect this.

The principal source of income is offerings from the congregation. Members continue to change from using Free Will Offering envelopes to Standing Orders. Standing Order donations increased by approximately 25% (approximately £12,500). Thus, collection plate cash donations and FWO envelope donations were down by almost 50% (approximately £15,300). Fabric Fund giving was static. However, members' donations in other forms, mainly single extra contributions were increased from approximately £3,400 to £13,700. Gift Aid recovery has increased by almost £1,500. The overall picture is therefore one of extra giving but with the realisation that repair costs will challenge us in 2022.

This has been discussed at the first meeting of the Congregational Board in 2022. Members are aware that we will have to address this issue. At the time of writing, we know not the extent of future Covid restrictions. Planning is therefore difficult. It is essential to keep stewardship of money in the hearts and minds of our members. We continue our participation in the Church of Scotland's National Stewardship Programme to raise the awareness of the need for all members regularly to review their giving to the Church.

### Risk Management

The trustees have overall responsibility for systems of procedure and control over the activities of the charity. Such systems can only provide reasonable, but not absolute, assurance against errors and fraud. Within this framework the trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, and they are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate the exposure to major risks

### **Reserves Policy**

The trustees have considered the reserves required and have considered current and future liabilities. It is the Trustees' policy to hold reserves of approximately 12 month's expenditure excluding designated funds. At the year end the Church held unrestricted funds of £191,267 of which £60,000 had been designated for the fabric fund and £20,000 for the organ fund. "Development Fund" presently standing at £26,000 consolidates legacies, to be used for the upgrading of our premises. The remaining balance of £85,267 represents over a half of one year's expenditure to provide for contingencies. The Church organ is valued at £310,000 so the organ and choir fund is held to ensure that all costs of maintenance can be met. The Guild Fund of £758 is used by the Guild treasurer to meet day-to-day needs.

### Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The members of the Kirk Session / Congregational Board must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Church during the financial year. The members of the Kirk Session / Congregational Board are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Church at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.

### Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Blairgowrie Parish Church of Scotland

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2021 which are set out on pages 9 to 15.

### Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006.

The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (d) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

### Basis of independent examiner's statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters.
