### Blairgowrie Parish Church of Scotland Trustees' Report Year ended 31 December 2019

The trustees present the annual report and financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31<sup>st</sup> December 2019. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the General Assembly Regulations for Congregational Finance, the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland published on 16 July 2014.

### **Objectives and Activities**

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

The Activities of the Church revolve around services of worship and include Sunday School, Youth Group, Messy Church, Bible Study and Prayer Groups, Social Club, Guild and Boys Brigade.

Services of worship in Blairgowrie Parish Church are aimed to meet the needs of the different age groups in our community, both members of the congregation and their families and those who come seeking some form of spirituality in their lives. Family services aimed at the younger members use up to date methods of presentation employing available audio-visual technology. More traditional forms of worship are used to appeal to the needs of the more mature worshippers.

The worship moves out into the community in our pastoral care for our housebound folk and members in times of crisis and goes out to the whole community in the town to offer services for funerals and weddings, whether those in need of these services are church members or not. Support is given to the Salvation Army.

The Sunday School and youth group use a variety of activities and materials for Christian education. The aim is to equip our young people to take their place in our community with the backing of a Christian ethos, giving them roots in our family of faith. Both the Guild and the Social Club, in addition to their traditional activities, devote much time and energy to fund raising for various Charities. The Boys Brigade Company has active sections at all age levels.

### Achievements and Performance

Our members continue their support of the activities of the church. Services continue to be well attended on Sundays at 11.00 a.m. and at our four-weekly 9.30 a.m. service. A number of young children regularly attend Sunday School. Our 'Jump for Joy Toddler Group' meets once a month and provides fellowship and support for young parents and their children. Messy Church services have been running now for many years, encouraging families to share the fellowship in worship activities and food. Progress has continued in the numbers attending and the good atmosphere of the fellowship in worship. Provision of facilities and activities for our teenage members of the community continue to be reviewed. The Boys Brigade members continue to participate, successfully, in competitions at Battalion level. Much of the success is directly attributable to the enthusiasm and dedication of the Officers and Leaders.

### Blairgowrie Parish Church of Scotland Trustees' Report Vear ended 31 December 2019

### Financial Review

The principal source of income continues to be offerings from the congregation which increased by 4%. Thus it is essential to keep stewardship of money in the hearts and minds of our members. We continue our participation in the Church of Scotland's National Stewardship Programme to raise the awareness of the need for all members regularly to review their giving to the Church.

### Risk Management

The trustees have overall responsibility for systems of procedure and control over the activities of the charity. Such systems can only provide reasonable, but not absolute, assurance against errors and fraud. Within this framework the trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed and they are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate the exposure to major risks.

### Reserves Policy

The trustees have considered the reserves required and have taken into account current and future liabilities. It is the Trustees' policy to hold reserves of approximately 12 month's expenditure excluding designated funds. At the year end the Church held unrestricted funds of £210,471 of which £60,000 had been designated for the fabric fund and £20,000 for the organ fund and £26,000 for a new fund designated 'Development'. The Trustees decided to consolidate legacies to be used for the upgrading of our premises. The remaining balance of £104,714 represents a little under one year's expenditure to provide for contingencies. The Church organ is valued at £310,000 so the organ and choir fund is held to ensure that all costs of maintenance can be met.

The Church also held £1,059 of restricted funds. The Benevolent Fund, which was held by the Minister and used, from time to time, to meet extraordinary needs in the Parish, is no longer relevant and the balance of £1,537 has been transferred into the General fund. The Guild Fund is used by the Guild treasurer to meet day-to-day needs.

### Structure, Governance and Management

The congregation is a registered charity, number SC033757 and is administered in accordance with the terms of the Model Deed of Constitution and is subject to the Acts and Regulations of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland.

Rev. Benjamin Abeledo was inducted to the charge on 20<sup>th</sup> June 2019, the previous Minister (Rev H. Mowbray) having retired on 31<sup>st</sup> August 2018. Rev A. Graham acted as Interim Moderator up until 20<sup>th</sup> June 2019.

Members of the Kirk Session and the Congregational Board are the charity trustees. The Minister is the chairman. The Kirk Session members are the Minister and the Elders of the church. The Kirk Session, which meets six times a year, is responsible for spiritual affairs within the church.

The Congregational Board is responsible for financial affairs and the maintenance of properties. The Board is chaired by the minister and meets five times in a year. Certain matters are delegated to the Finance Committee and the Property Committee as appropriate.

### Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

The Kirk Session members are the Elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery.

The Congregational Board is appointed from within the congregation. Members of the congregation are invited to nominate individuals who are believed to have the skills and commitment to contribute to the management affairs of the Church. Board Members are then appointed at the Stated Annual Meeting and serve for a period of three years after which they can seek re-election at the next Stated Annual Meeting.

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2019 which are set out on pages 7 to 19.

### Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended).

- 2. to which, in my opinion, attention should be drawn in order to enable a proper understanding of the accounts to be reached.

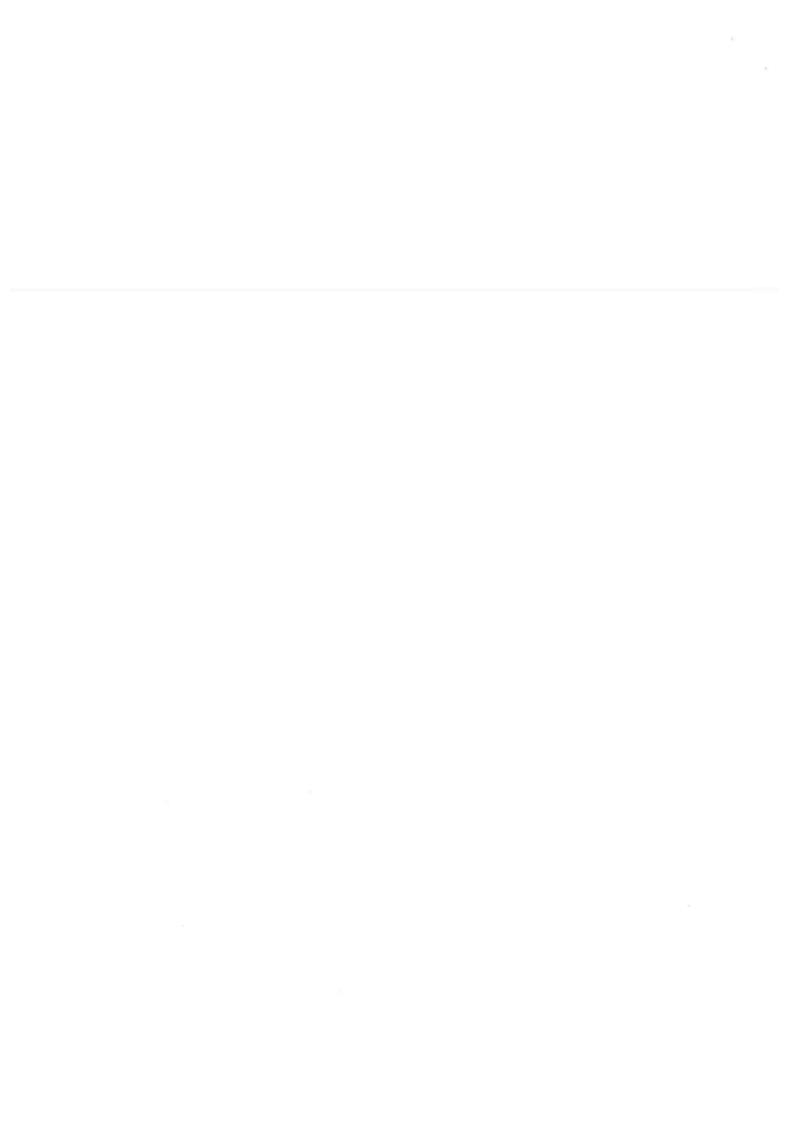

### Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies, which have been applied consistently in the current and preceding year in dealing with items which are considered material to the accounts, are set out below.

### Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standards applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) issued on 16 July 2014 and the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102), the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended).

### Fund accounting

Funds are classified as either restricted funds or unrestricted funds, defined as follows.

Restricted funds are funds subject to specific requirements as to their use which may be declared by the donor or with their authority or created through legal processes, but still within the wider objects of the charity.

Endowment funds are funds which have been given on the condition that the original capital sum is not reduced, but the income there from is used for the purpose defined in accordance with the objects of the charity.

Unrestricted funds are expendable at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the objects of the charity. If parts of the unrestricted funds are earmarked at the discretion of the trustees for a particular purpose, they are designated as a separate fund. This designation has an administrative purpose only and does not legally restrict the trustees' discretion to apply the fund.

### Incoming Resources

Income is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the item(s) of income have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

### **Expenditure Recognition**

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to make a payment to a third party, it is probable that settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is classified under the following headings:

- Costs of raising funds
- Expenditure on charitable activities
- Other expenditure represents those items not falling into any other heading.

Accounting policies (continued)

### Donated services and facilities

Donated professional services and donated facilities are recognised as income when the charity has control over the item, any conditions associated with the donated item have been met, the receipt of economic benefit from the use by the charity of the item is probable and that economic benefit can be measured reliably. In accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS102) the general volunteer time of congregation members is not recognised.

On receipt, donated professional services and donated facilities are recognised on the basis of the value of the gift to the charity which is the amount the charity would have been willing to pay to obtain services or facilities of equivalent economic benefit on the open market; a corresponding amount is then recognised as expenditure in the period of receipt.

### Interest receivable

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably by the charity; this is normally upon notification of the interest paid or payable by the Bank.

### Investments

Fixed asset investments are stated at market value at the balance sheet date. Unrealised gains and losses represent the difference between the market value at the beginning and end of the financial year or, if purchased in the year, the difference between cost and market value at the end of the year. Realised gains and losses represent the difference between the proceeds on disposal and the market value at the start of the year or cost if purchased in the year.

### Taxation

Blairgowrie Parish Church is recognised as a charity for the purposes of applicable taxation legislation and is therefore not subject to taxation on its charitable activities. The charity is not registered for VAT and resources expended therefore include irrecoverable input VAT.

For the year under review the minimum stipend was £27,585 and the maximum stipend (in the tenth and subsequent years) £33,899

### 7. Trustee Remuneration and Related Party Transactions

During the year, the Minister, Rev. B. Abeledo received expenses of £690, the Manse Council Tax of £1,867 was paid by the Charity and a one-off removal expense of £1,968.

No other trustee received any remuneration or reimbursement of expenses during the year.

No trustee or a person related to a trustee had any personal interest in any contract or transaction entered into by the charity during the year.

During the year a total of £24,485 was donated to the congregation by trustees

### Volunteers

In common with all congregations of the Church of Scotland the congregation benefits from the contribution made by volunteers who give their time and talents willingly for the benefit of the Church. The areas of congregational life which rely on the contribution of volunteers are many and varied and much of the activity would be unable to continue were it not for the commitment shown.
